IIMM SEALS NEW PARTNERSHIPS WITH MONGOLIA

From 18 to 21 December, **Dr Hyung Suk MOON** made an official visit to Mongolia, where he represented the International Institute of World Music. This was an opportunity for the Honorary President of the IIMM to forge fruitful partnerships with the Mongolian Arts and Culture world.

Meetings with Ms. Chinbat NOMIN, Minister of Culture in Mongolia and Mr. Nyamaa ENKHBOLD, Congressman at the Parliament of Mongolia have enabled the IIMM to establish interesting and promising relations.

At the University of Ulan Bator, the Honorary President of the IIMM met the Rector of the Mongolian National Conservatory, **Dr Tserenjigmed SHARAVTSEREN**, **Professor Erdenetsogt SONINTOGOS**, Rector of the University of Arts and Culture, as well as **Ms. Khulan RAGCHAA**, Director of the Mongolian dance company « Goolingoo Dance Club » and **Mr. Temuujin AYURZANA**, Consultant for Mongolian Culture. The signing of a cooperation protocol will enable future joint operations to be developed with teachers from our two countries in the fields of education and culture: exchanges, teaching, master classes, artistic events, etc.











TEACHING NOMADIC TRADITIONS IN AUBAGNE



The musical traditions perpetuated in Mongolia are among the richest and most original in Asia. These nomadic traditions, handed down orally from master to disciple over the generations, have found a unique place to flourish in Aubagne. Since 2020, throat or **diphonic singing**, **long singing** and **morin kuur** or horse-headed fiddle have been taught at the IIMM.

Around ten students are enrolled in Mr. Johanni CURTET's teaching programme, as part of certification and diploma courses, masterclasses and meetings with exceptional Mongolian singers and musicians invited to Provence. In this perspective, the Institute will welcome masters such as Ms. Erdenetsetseg KHENMEDEKH, specialized in Urtyn duu as well as Mr. Batsükh DORJ and Mr. Baldandorj AVIRMED, well-known for Tuvan khöömii, epics of the Altaï and tsuur flute.

NEW: FROM AUGUST 10TH TO 18TH 2024, THE IIMM WILL BE HOLDING ITS 1ST MASTERCLASS IN MONGOLIA



To celebrate its 4th year of existence, the khöömii course initiated by IIMM and **Mr. Johanni CURTET** will take place in Mongolia. A unique opportunity to develop the practice in the land of diphonic singing! The course begins with two days in the Mongolian National University of Arts and Culture in the capital, Ulan Bator, with a master who is emblematic of academic teaching, and continues for a week in the Altaï, in one of the regions where khöömii originated, with a holder of the rural tradition. Accompanied by **Mr. Johanni CURTET**, who has been learning and researching khöömii for 20 years, this masterclass explores a number of dimensions, from the connection to nature and the nomadic lifestyle to urban and contemporary realities.
